Meet Darrell Ray Edwards

Darrell Ray Edwards, who was living in a transitional housing program was referred to our South Bay One-Stop Business & Career Centers by his Parole agent shortly after his release from State prison serving a nearly 30-year life sentence. He had limited work history and also faced challenges with his use and understanding of technology.

Prior to his incarceration, Darrell served in the U.S. Marine Corps during the Vietnam era, which made him eligible for specialized services for Veterans including housing, healthcare, disability benefits and supportive services. He also received assistance in the areas of email use, resume preparation, accessing online applications, financial literacy, and various other valuable resources.

Darrell began a subsidized Paid Work Experience program as an industrial mechanic trainee with a Gardena based vitamin packaging company. While in custody of the State, Darrell obtained experience working with industrial machines and performing general maintenance duties, making him an ideal candidate for this position. Upon completing his work experience, Darrell successfully secured a permanent position with the same company. He is grateful for the services received and is diligently working and saving to get a car and an apartment.

Meet Isabel Aguallo

Isabel Aguallo, a youth participant and CalWORKs recipient from Carson, was referred to our One Stop Center for job search assistance. She was seeking employment to assist her grandmother financially, who was raising her alone. Isabel was enrolled into the "Fit for Gold" Program where she was introduced to various workshops including resume assistance, job shadowing, company tours and career fairs.



She received leadership and mentor coaching, life skills guidance, financial literacy, financial aid training, college bound seminars and tutoring assistance. She successfully completed both Blueprint I and Blueprint II work readiness training and was awarded a Gold Level Certification. She completed 120 hours of paid work experience where she exercised the leadership skills she had recently learned to mentor youth in her community at Carson Park. Isabel has successfully graduated from high school with a 4.09 GPA and will be attending California State University, Fullerton.

Meet Larry Miranda



Larry Miranda Jr, a low-income individual on Parole, living in a transitional housing program was referred to our South Bay Business & Career Centers by his Parole. Mr. Miranda was enrolled in the Prison to Employment program to access specialized services in preparation for his transition and reintegration into the workforce.

Due to his limited work experience following a 20-year life sentence he was immediately guided to develop a career pathway plan to reach his desired employment objectives. Shortly after his enrollment and in response to the growing demand for truck drivers during the pandemic, Mr. Miranda was quickly enrolled and scheduled to begin a Commercial Truck Driving Certificate program with

partner training provider, Career Expansion. Despite challenges associated with the pandemic and limited services from the DMV, Mr. Miranda successfully completed the classroom component of the program and obtained his Class A Commercial Truck Driving License.

Utilizing an Earn-and-Learn model under the Prison to Employment program, Mr. Miranda was selected for an assistant instructor position with an intent to hire upon completion of his 300 hours. Participation in a wage-based learning activity will grant him the opportunity to earn wages, utilize his recently obtained industry knowledge, and gain valuable professional skills to train others in this growing industry. Less than one year from his release from a state facility, his goals changed to now include becoming a Truck Driving Instructor, helping others find meaningful career paths and making a successful reintegration into the community.

"Sometimes life will put you in the direction you least expect. With this second chance at life and freedom, I carry with me the consequences of my past, which motivate me to be grateful and always steer myself in the right direction"
